



We have enjoyed another successful year of collaboration, including a vibrant Finals Fest and engaging school holiday activations that connected our local EFNL community.

In 2025, we have further strengthened our partnerships and introduced new opportunities that continue to elevate the EFNL brand. SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Congratulations to all football and netball teams who competed in all our Senior and Junior competitions in 2025. Attendances were again among the strongest of any community league in Victoria with a combined winning margin of just 16 points across the Five Men's Division Grand Finals - a testament to the competitiveness across the board. The CCSP and salary cap is continuing to play an important in supporting this.

It was a year filled with storylines – from Balwyn and Scoresby going back-to-back in our Senior Men's football, Park Orchards winning the Premiership from fourth position in the Women's Premier Division and Croydon taking home the flag in Premier netball.

As we look forward, we will continue to explore the best venues to host our finals series and provide the best showcase for our league.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

The EFNL remains in a strong financial position despite rising operational costs. The league will again report a modest surplus, reflecting sound fiscal management along with a disciplined approach to cost management and budgeting. In 2026 we plan to use this surplus to reinvest into our clubs by keeping costs in check, invest in further development of our umpires and as the league continues to grow, an investment in further club development resources to ensure the delivery of high-quality services and support for our expanding club network.



FROM THE CEO



AS I LOOK BACK ON MY THIRD YEAR LEADING THE EASTERN FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE, I REMAIN IMMENSELY PROUD OF THE GROWTH, PROFESSIONALISM, AND SPIRIT SHOWN ACROSS OUR CLUBS, COMPETITIONS, AND WIDER COMMUNITY. IT CONTINUES TO BE A PRIVILEGE TO LEAD THIS REMARKABLE LEAGUE – ONE BUILT ON THE DEDICATION AND HARD WORK OF OUR CLUBS, VOLUNTEERS AND STAFF.

The 2025 season again demonstrated the EFNL's resilience and commitment to our key strategic pillars: Clubs, Participation, Community & Partnerships, Operational Excellence, and Financial Sustainability.

Our organisational structure continued to drive performance and support the operations of the league, with Dean O'Neill, Daniel Houeix, Laura Frost, Scott Van Noordennen, Ryan Long, Alice Cook, and Kirsty Jamieson all playing vital roles. We strengthened our capacity further by appointing Heath Black as Club & Community Manager, enhancing the support we provide to clubs across the league.

The EFNL continues to lead community sport nationally. In 2025, we recorded exceptional participation numbers, attendance figures, continued the rapid expansion of women and girls' participation, and further reinforced our position as Australia's largest and most professional community football and netball league. Key highlights included:

- Over 22,000 registered participants across all competitions and officials.
- 470 junior teams beginning the 2025 season
- 80 Grand Finals decided across all our competitions.
- Over 800 attendees at the Junior Presentation Night
- New commercial partnerships with DNA Recruitment and Mercure Doncaster
- Major event growth, including the inaugural EFNL Women's Breakfast and the Premier Grand Final Lunch.

Our senior men's, women's and veterans' competitions again showcased high-quality and evenly matched football. We challenged the norm and welcomed several new venues to host our senior finals in Beaconsfield and Kilsyth. This provided new opportunities for our members and generated new and exciting finals venues. Thank you to Dean O'Neill for his work delivering several competitions, maintaining the integrity of the CCSP program and the operations of the 2025 finals series. A record finals series delivering vital revenue to clubs and creating a vibrant atmosphere across the league.

The Senior Women's program continued to grow to six divisions and 41 teams and highlighted the depth and competitiveness of female football across our league. We will continue to invest in the women's and girls' space not only on the field but also off. We are excited to see more women in leadership roles within the league, and this will only grow in the coming years.

We were also delighted to see Bulleen Templestowe march into Division 4, and we look forward to Templestowe Junior Football Club joining the EFNL in 2026.

Junior football experienced another strong year of growth, with a total of 470 teams, representing 40 clubs, competing across 57 divisions – a 5% increase in participation from 2024.

Our girls' competition continued its remarkable expansion:

- 113 teams across 16 divisions
- Representation from 31 clubs
- Up from 101 girls' teams in 2024 and 91 in 2023

Boys' and mixed competitions also grew to 357 teams, providing further evidence of strong junior participation across our region.

Our Interleague Program again set a high standard, with Division 1 and 2 squads represented in U14 Boys, U15 Boys and U15 Girls, and – for the first time – a team entered in the Division 1 U14 Girls competition. The EFNL interleague program continues to feed talent pathways and prepare our players for the next level. This progress is a credit to Daniel Houeix's value he has placed on the development pathways and his leadership in this space. The results have been recognised in the number of EFNL players representing Talent league programs, SSV state teams and drafted into the AFL and AFLW.

Netball continued to organically surge under the guidance of Alice Cook, reaching new participation records sprawling over 8 venues for winter and summer season. The competition expanded by 13%, from 115 teams in 2024 to 130 teams representing 39 clubs in 2025, with more than 2,100 participants involved. We welcomed Ashwood, Donvale, Fairpark and Surrey Park into the competition, and expanded to 16 senior divisions. The EFNL Summer Season also grew significantly, with 41 teams across 5 divisions and representation from 22 clubs.


Umpiring remains fundamental to the strength of our league, and I extend a sincere thank you to Scott Van Noordennen, David Parker from the EFLUA, Sean Clarke, Sean Fraser, and the entire umpiring cohort for their dedication and professionalism.

Key achievements included:

- 98.1% fill rate for junior appointments across the season
- 70% of senior men's and women's Grand Finals officiated by umpires who progressed through our junior pathway
- High levels of umpire involvement across junior finals, building experience and supporting retention

These results reflect the significant investment in this space from the league, the strength of our umpiring development program and the commitment of our officials.

Support for clubs increased this year through the introduction of Heath Black as Club & Community Manager. No stranger to the league having recently coached in 2024 and also a past player. Heath hit the ground running, and his work has enhanced club capacity, improved community connections, and strengthened governance and sustainability across the league. We are not immune at club land, and we must ensure we remain vigilant to support our clubs and long-term sustainability. This will remain a focus and key driver for season 2026 and beyond.



In 2025, we invested heavily in strengthening our digital reach and media presence. These channels continued to promote the league and achieved significant audience reach:

Premier Division Grand Final reached 19,000 viewers on YouTube and 33,000 on Facebook – both EFNL records. 107,000 YouTube views and 227,800 Facebook views across the Finals Series. We lifted our platform followers to over 50k and renewed our partnership with Premier Data, delivering valuable insights to coaches and enhancing league promotion. We launched the reintroduction of the EFNL Record, published weekly during the home-and-away season, featuring team lists, feature stories, and Match of the Round previews.

My thanks to Ryan Long, the EFNL Media Team and LKLM Media for their support and professionalism.

We continued to work closely with local councils, AFL Victoria, Netball Victoria and government stakeholders to deliver high-quality facilities for our clubs. Our partnerships with Maroondah, Knox, Whitehorse, Monash, Boroondara, Casey, Cardinia, Manningham, Yarra Ranges and Greater Dandenong remain essential to the delivery of safe, reliable and accessible community sporting venues.

Major events included:

- Junior Presentation Night
- Inaugural Women’s Breakfast at Mercure Doncaster
- Premier Division Grand Final Lunch at Mercure Doncaster
- The 2025 Chandler Medal, hosted at Marvel Stadium, which attracted over 600 attendees and showcased the EFNL at a new level of professionalism.

Appreciation must be extended to Kirsty Jamieson for her dedicated support of our vision and continuously executing this across the league.

The league delivered another strong financial outcome in 2025. High finals attendance generated important revenue streams, contributing to a modest surplus while managing rising operational and insurance costs.

Efficiency improvements have strengthened our service delivery, while maintaining financial stability across the league. Thank you to Laura Frost in her second season for her valuable assistance. We continue to explore opportunities for an EFNL-owned headquarters and central competition base – a key strategic objective moving forward.

The success of the EFNL is built on the collective efforts of our Board, staff, umpires, media and volunteers. I would like to thank Chair Paul Barlow, Vice Chair Kevin Smith, and all Board members for their leadership and commitment.

To our EFNL staff – Laura, Dean, Kirsty, Scott, Daniel, Heath, Ryan and Alice – thank you for your exceptional professionalism and unwavering dedication.

Our league remains strong because of your work.

Finally, thank you to our clubs, coaches, players, officials and volunteers. Your support and commitment are the foundations of our league.

We move into 2026 with excitement and determination to continue leading the way in community sport across Australia.

SENIOR FOOTBALL

ANOTHER YEAR IS DONE AND DUSTED. WITH ARGUABLY THE BEST SEASON THUS FAR. AGAIN, WE HAD RECORD NUMBERS FOR PARTICIPATION AND THE NUMBER OF TEAMS COMPETING IN OUR DIVISIONAL FOOTBALL.

Our Grand Final results were remarkable. Balwyn claiming back-to-back Premier Division flags by 3 points over Blackburn. South Belgrave holding off a gallant Park Orchards by 2 points and thus earning promotion into Premier Division for the first time in their history. Wantirna South overcame a 6-goal deficit to get up over Templestowe by 1 point. Scoresby also won back-to-back flags in Division 3 after winning Division 4 last season over the hot favourite Donvale. Division 4 saw Whitehorse Pioneers outplay Chirnside Park who charged home late to win by 8 points. The total combined margin was just 16 points across 5 divisions – an unbelievable outcome across the league.

Premier Women's Division also produced a nail biter, with Park Orchards claiming the premiership by 3 points over South Belgrave. In our other divisions, North Ringwood defeated Surrey Park in Division 1. Division 2 saw Mooroolbark complete a threepeat by defeating Montrose. This is a great testament to the Women's program at Mooroolbark Football Club. Division 3 saw Heathmont defeat Coldstream. Vermont defeated Wantirna South by 3 points and Norwood won the inaugural Division 5 flag overcoming Heathmont.

COMPETITIVE FOOTBALL

Once again, the divisional structure of our competitions produced an average margin across the entire competition of just 34 points. Premier Division was our most even with the combined margins of 4 goals and Division 2 just 29 points. The finals race in all divisions was alive heading into Round 17 & 18. Division 4 had two virtual elimination finals in Round 18. Kilsyth prevailed over Bulleen Templestowe and Warrandyte defeated Croydon North to claim the last two finals spots. Premier Division also had seven sides alive going into Round 18 - South Croydon and Noble Park faced off in a do or die clash with the Bulldogs prevailing and securing 5th spot.

We saw again the growth in our Women's competition with 41 sides competing across 6 divisions. Another completed year of divisional football for our Women also saw the average margin decrease year on year. Clubs have indicated that they will be entering new Women's sides into Season 2026, so this growth will continue.

MEDAL WINNERS

The 2025 Chandler Medal was awarded to both Josh Tovey from East Ringwood and Toby Wooller from Blackburn. They tied the award with 20 votes. In an exciting count Toby polled 3 votes in the last game of the year to level Josh who had led for the majority of the count.

In the other major awards, Mitch Mellis from Boronia claimed his third competition best and fairest award in a row. In another dominant season Mitch polled 26 votes, 2 votes ahead of Brayden Laplanche from Montrose on 24 votes. Mitch has now become a legend of the league. Congratulations Mitch.

Tom Smith won his second league best and fairest, claiming the Division 2 Paul Edie medal with 25 votes, 3 votes clear of Nathan Denes from Wantirna South and Beau Mitchener from Templestowe.

Jordan Camilleri from Scoresby won the Division 3 Perc Jones Medal with 27 votes, 8 votes clear of Jaidyn Stephenson from Ferntree Gully.

Our newest club Bulleen Templestowe crowned one of their own with Jake Sticca winning the Stephen Jones medal with 23 votes, 2 clear from Edward Sim of Whitehorse.

In our Premier Women, Shaneece Stratton from the Eastern Devils won with 18 votes, 4 votes clear from joint runners up Celine Moody from South Belgrave and Ellie MacDonald from Eastern Devils.

Congratulations to all the other award winners on a fantastic season!

TRIBUNAL

In another positive our reported incidents and subsequent tribunal hearings decreased dramatically this season. Overall, there was a reduction of 42% in reported incidents, both match day and MRO's and a reduction of 23% in yellow cards issued. This is a testament to the calibre of players being attracted to our league.





SEASON REVIEW

- We welcomed our newest club into the EFNL. Bulleen Templestowe hosted Warrandyte at Ted Ajani Reserve on April 5. In a tight and tough contest, it was the Bullant's who prevailed over Warrandyte by 3 points.
- The Premier Season kicked off on April 12. Mitcham unfurled their Division 1 flag as they hosted Vermont on a stand-alone Sunday. A huge crowd was in attendance to see Vermont come from behind, thanks to a Sam Weideman masterclass, kicking 4 last quarter goals and 7 for the game to get the Eagles home.
- Many close games were held across all divisions. A few were decided on the last kick with one decided after the siren when Lachlan Poli from Croydon North MLOC slotted home the winner over Whitehorse Pioneers. Mooroolbark's Jett Hartman sealed the deal after the siren against Boronia which sent them into an elimination final.
- Park Orchards went back-to-back claiming the Premier Women's Division premiership over South Belgrave by 3 points after winning the Division 1 crown in 2024. Newly promoted Mooroolbark would again shine in Division 2 only losing 1 game for the year to go on and claim a three-peat.
- Other Premiers were North Ringwood in Division 1, Heathmont in Division 3, Vermont in Division 4 and Norwood in Division 5
- North Ringwood would again claim the Men's Veterans premiership and Blackburn would win their first Women's Veterans flag. Congratulations to all.
- Congratulations must also go to our newest 300 game Life Members. To an EFNL Legend in Joel Galvin of Bayswater, Chris Cox from Ferntree Gully and Josh Allison of Fairpark. Well done on stellar careers.
- Following an outstanding and well-attended finals series that drew more than 56,000 spectators, Whitehorse Pioneers, Scoresby, Wantirna South, South Belgrave, and Balwyn claimed the Senior Men's premierships..

FINALS VENUES

This year we welcomed two new venues and welcomed back East Burwood for a couple of games. Beaconsfield hosted three Premier finals and Kilsyth hosted the Division 1 finals series. All venues had an amazing number of volunteers assisting in showcasing the league. Big thank you also to our regular venues in Bayswater, Mitcham, Ringwood, East Ringwood, Heathmont, North Ringwood and Silvan.

THANK YOU

My second year in the role provided exciting times however not without its challenges. Maintaining integrity is paramount to the success of the league. Careful consideration is given to all decisions to ensure this is upheld. The efforts of our Clubs, volunteers, committee members, and spectators who help week in and week out a massive thank you. The league would not be in a position it is today without these efforts.

Looking ahead to 2026 we will again make subtle changes to the independent tribunal system & MRO with also a continual review of bylaws after listening to our member clubs via our annual survey.

Our umpiring numbers were again strong, surpassing over 650 registered umpires this season. This is a testament to our Umpire manager Scott Van Noordennen. His passion for umpiring is second to none and these numbers highlight this. To Sean Clarke and Sean Fraser and the junior coaching group who handle the Junior umpires thank you also. The group continues to go from strength to strength.

To the league support staff, tribunal panel members, match review, and finals staff—thank you for all your hard work and dedication.

The EFNL team continuously deliver amazing results. This is highlighted in not only our finals football but also our four major functions - the Junior Presentation Night, the Women's Grand Final Breakfast, Premier Grand Final Lunch and The Chandler Medal Night. All massive events that go off without a hitch, thanks to the high-quality preparation applied. Thanks to Jy, Kirsty, Daniel, Scott, Ryan, Alice, Heath and Laura for all your support and assistance this season.

JUNIOR FOOTBALL

COMPETITION OVERVIEW

Season 2025 was a year of significant growth within the junior program. 470 teams, representing 40 junior clubs competed across 57 highly competitive divisions. Our participation numbers saw a 5% increase from 2024, with 9,997 junior players proudly wearing their club colours each Sunday.

The significant growth can be attested to our U8's mixed program, which saw 31 of our clubs field an enormous 72 teams this season. Our host clubs – Chirnside Park, Donvale, Fairpark and Rowville Knights, did a tremendous job in ensuring that each player's first experience within our league was a memorable one.

This year also marked the debut of the U8 Girls competition in the league. A big congratulations to our competing clubs – East Ringwood, Mitcham, North Ringwood, Rowville and The Basin. It was terrific to see so many young girls take to the field and have the opportunity to compete in their very own competition. Thank you to North Ringwood, who hosted this competition at Quambee Reserve each Sunday morning. We look forward to seeing more clubs field U8 Girls teams in 2026 and are excited to watch this competition continue to grow and thrive.

After fielding 91 teams in 2023 and 101 teams in 2024, our girls competition again had a substantial increase, with 113 teams competing across 16 divisions. We now have 31 of our clubs represented in the girls competition, which is a testament to the hard work and dedication these club volunteers are committing to ensure this space continues to flourish. In the 41 mixed/boys divisions, the EFNL saw 357 teams represented, an increase from 326 in 2024. These numbers highlight the strength and continued growth of junior participation across the league, and we look forward to building on this momentum in 2026.

UNDER 7S PROGRAM

The U7's program which is conducted by the EFNL in collaboration with AFL Victoria was another major success. The four-week series that concluded in August saw record numbers in participation, with over 660 players in attendance across the four days. Thank you to both Upper Ferntree Gully and Heathmont for allowing us to use their facilities throughout this series, and to the competing clubs who provided playing jumpers to help ensure all participants had an experience they will not forget.

The U7's program attributes much of its success to Alice Hansen and Josh Mackie from AFL Victoria. Thank you for the tireless hours you both put into the planning and coordination of this program, and congratulations on this well-deserved success.

JUNIOR FINALS

The junior season rounded out with a three-week finals series. A big thank you to the eighteen clubs that hosted these finals matches, and to the volunteers that worked tireless hours to ensure a great experience to all that were involved. Congratulations to the 34 clubs who had at least one competing team throughout the finals series.

The finals series was concluded on Sunday August 24th with a sensational Junior Grand Final Day. Great weather made for a pleasant experience for all players, coaches, officials, families and friends who attended one of our ten venues. The day saw 27 different clubs compete in 41 grand finals, with 20 different clubs ending victorious. A special shoutout to the Blackburn Junior Football Club who ended the day with seven premierships, and to the Rowville Junior Football Club who ended the day with five.

JUNIOR PRESENTATION NIGHT

The final event on the 2025 junior calendar was the Junior Presentation Night, held on September 1st at Crossway Baptist Church, Burwood East. Over 800 people were in attendance for what was a great evening. Congratulations to all of the players who received league best and fairest awards on the night, a great recognition for a terrific individual season from each of you. On the night we also announced the Best Conducted Team in each of our divisions. This award was presented to the teams with the highest average in overall behaviour for the season. Overall behaviour takes into consideration the behaviour of players, coaches, team officials and spectators, and is ranked between 1 and 5 by the umpires at the end of each match. Congratulations to all teams who were awarded the best conducted team in their division. A special shoutout to the Montrose Junior Football Club, who had a team win the award in six different divisions.

Whilst the night often reflects on the individual efforts of players, we feel it important to also recognise the work of Coaches and Volunteers within our competition. As a result, the league decided to award both a Junior Coach of the Year and a Junior Volunteer of the Year award for the 2025 season. One of the final awards on the night saw the league present the Gordon Parker Best Conducted Junior Club award to the club which carries out their duties in a manner which is most conducive to the leagues expectations, as well as having acted in a manner which best aligns with the EFNL values. Furthermore, the award also takes into consideration the overall behaviour of all teams from this club.

Congratulations to the Bayswater Junior Football Club for winning the award in season 2025. Having fielded 11 junior teams this year, the Bayswater Junior Football Club received zero white cards, and only two yellow cards throughout the entire season. They also scored a terrific 14.63 out of 15 for overall club behaviour - the highest for any club who fielded a competitive team this season. I would like to commend Club President Beccy Dawber and the entire Bayswater Junior committee for their outstanding work not only this year, but over the past few seasons as well.

JUNIOR INTERLEAGUE

The 2025 Junior Interleague program saw significant change, whereby training sessions and practice matches began back in November 2024, and ran throughout the summer period. This mirrors the experience each of our athletes will receive when they transition into the Coates Talent League program, and so our objective is to ensure each player is best prepared for this. Both our U14 Boys teams, our U15 Division 1 Girls and U15 Division 2 Boys won two of their three matches. 

NETBALL

IN 2025, THE EFNL RINGWOOD MAZDA NETBALL COMPETITION ACHIEVED A HISTORIC MILESTONE, WELCOMING THE GREATEST NUMBER OF TEAMS AND CLUBS IN ITS HISTORY.

Season 2025 marked another record-breaking year, surpassing 2024's record netball participation numbers. The competition saw an impressive 13% increase from 115 teams across 35 clubs in 2024 to a remarkable 130 teams representing 39 senior clubs, with over 2,000 participants both on and off the court. The league welcomed Ashwood, Donvale, Fairpark and Surrey Park to the competition. An expansion to 16 divisions provided all teams and their players with an opportunity for success, highlighted with a thrilling Finals Series seeing 13 clubs achieve a Premiership.

The competition continued to see several Victorian Netball League (VNL) players representing many of our senior clubs, with a number of players also selected to represent Dandenong Valley Region at Netball Victoria's State Titles, further highlighting the excellence of the competition and the talent we have within the region.

The continued participation growth and achievements at the higher level is a testament not only to the high-quality, professional standard of the competition but also to the exceptional support and leadership of our clubs' committees, who remain steadfast in their commitment to empowering women in sport.

Summer Season continued for its second year, commencing in November 2024. The competition saw a significant increase, expanding to 41 teams across 5 divisions and representation of 22 clubs. The Grand Finals were represented by 8 clubs out of the 10 teams competing, of which 5 clubs became Premiers. We congratulate all clubs who took part in the Summer Competition for their efforts and support throughout the season, which continues to prove its value within the EFNL netball community.

BROADCASTING

From covering the first ever Bulleen Templestowe EFNL game to the Premier Division nail-biting Grand Final, there's been plenty of memorable highlights in this year's broadcasts.

Our broadcast numbers hit new heights in 2025, particularly across finals time. The 2025 Premier Division Grand Final between Balwyn and Blackburn reached up to 19,000 views on our EFNL YouTube page and a total of 33,300 via Facebook.

As the Senior Women's competition grew in 2025, the league had its most viewed Home and Away live-streamed game. This year's ANZAC Day clash between South Croydon and Boronia surpassed 1,200 viewers on YouTube.

We continued to work with LKLM Media to produce our live-streamed games. Leigh Green and the crew have continued to put together a fantastic production through live streamed weekly games and live-streamed events such as the Junior Presentation Night and Chandler Medal Night. The production elements through the Grand Finals have been a highlight of the 2025 season.

SOCIAL MEDIA AND PODCASTING

This year we reintroduced the weekend Eastern Football Netball League Record. The Record is an online publication, released every Friday of the Home and Away season via the EFNL website. It included all senior team line-ups for the weekend, media team tips, feature articles and Match of the Round previews.

Our main two key Social Media platforms in Facebook and Instagram saw our reach and growth continue to rise. The EFNL Instagram page hitting 22,000 followers, Facebook at 29,000.

The league partnered with Jay Ado Media for the third consecutive season, putting together the Chandler Medal graphics for 2025 via our social media platforms.

In 2025, we introduced new programs to our regular weekly content. EFNL Insight was added as a monthly YouTube show, a more visual behind the scenes show.

Our Podcast platform on Spotify has grown once again in 2025 with over 70 podcasts recorded from March to October. Across that period, we've had over 45,000 plays, equating to roughly 9,900 consumption hours from listeners.

Alongside our regular weekly podcasts, we've introduced other segments such as 'Spider's Web', which involves media team member Matt 'Spider' Lee going back into the archives and speaking to EFNL Legends and stars of the competition about their time in the league. The guests so far have included ten time Vermont premiership player Craig Gislingham and journeyman Leigh Odermatt.



UMPIRING



WHEN I TOOK THE ROLE OF UMPIRE OPERATIONS MANAGER IN OCTOBER OF 2022, WE HAD A VERY STRONG DISCUSSION AND A CLEAR DIRECTION AROUND WHAT WE WANTED TO ACHIEVE OVER THE NEXT THREE SEASONS.

We identified that the access to club umpiring opportunities had diminished from the added pressure of clubs needing these people to be volunteers at their clubs, due to a lack of volunteers overall in community sport. As a result, we needed to make our junior umpires club stronger.

We needed to ensure that our environment at both our junior and senior clubs were aligned around our key values of community, fairness, respect, integrity and excellence and finally we needed to see greater opportunities from our pathway being offered to our junior umpires. Our club is a safe supportive environment that enables us to provide quality coaching to our umpires and provide opportunities for our umpires to grow as people in our community and through our umpiring pathway.

RECRUITMENT

Over the past three seasons we have recruited over 600 new umpires (2023 – 280, 2024 – 170, 2025 – 170 to our junior and senior umpiring programs. We now have some strong links with strong umpire recruitment from our junior clubs. We pride ourselves on having a great seven week program for new umpires called “Flags & Whistles”. All new umpires receive coaching and opportunities to try all three disciplines and then make a choice about what discipline they would like umpire in the upcoming season.

RETENTION

The retention of new umpires remains a challenge with match day environments being a major contributing factor to their departure. Of the 450 we recruited in 2023/24 we have only 250 that are still with us in season 2025. If we want our new umpires to grow in confidence and stay involved for years to come, we all need to play our part – by showing encouragement and support on match day.

DEVELOPMENT

This season we have seen around 140 umpires transition from Sunday junior umpiring to our Seniors on Saturdays in both our Men’s and Women’s football competitions in either field, boundary or goal umpiring.

In the finals campaign in season 2022 40% of all the senior men’s and women’s grand final appointments were filled by umpires that had progressed from our Junior program into our senior umpiring program.

In 2025, 70% of all of our men’s and women’s grand finals were filled by umpires progressing from juniors to seniors in our umpiring program. A large percentage of these umpires also umpired in our Junior Finals campaign which added more experience to the series.

Throughout the season our umpires coaches identify in both our junior and senior competitions umpires those that we can develop and pathway within these competitions. We then deliver regular structured coaching sessions and programs and follow this up with consistent feedback via match day observations and communication.

UMPIRE FILL RATES

JUNIORS

The results for the season around appointment fill rates meant that in our junior games we managed to fill 98.1% of the games with their allotted umpire requirements. This is an amazing outcome as we all know it can be a challenge to have everybody available each week. Sean Clarke (Junior Umpires Head Coach) and his team have done a fabulous job this year to achieve this result.

Whilst our numbers increased, we still have, like many clubs, challenges around availability. Several umpires double up or just do extra games to make sure that a game of football goes ahead.

SENIORS

All Field umpire appointment commitments were met in season 2025. This season ten new umpires progressed into seniors as field umpires and some of these figured strongly in our finals campaign. We appreciated those Clubs that assisted at times when we may have been short, particularly in goals and boundary spots at times.

FINALS 2025

In what was an amazing finals series, the performance by our umpires in the 2025 Junior and Senior finals series was strong. The finals series saw a great mix of youth and senior appointments to finals games, and they all performed well. This season we became more predictable amongst each other as umpires and the team aspect has grown amongst the group which gives us a higher and more consistent level of umpiring in the league.

Their unwavering support and passion in coaching, development and providing feedback to the umpires throughout the season has been critical to the success of our umpiring group. Our coaching numbers increased, and this has certainly contributed to the development and growth of our umpires.

Our Junior program, under the guidance of Head Coach -Sean Clarke with our new Appointments Manager in Sean Fraser and the assistance of Graeme Meredith and the inclusion of two assistant coaches in Jordan Kennedy and Teah Smith, continues to produce quality young umpires who if they want to progress their umpiring can step up to Saturday football.

The task of filling over 360 appointments each Sunday is huge and very rarely was there a game that didn't have at least one field umpire. This is a mighty effort and cannot be understated. A big thankyou to Sean Fraser who had a fantastic season with a fill rate of appointments at 98%.

Thanks to our Fitness Trainer Mal Cree for providing training

programs during pre- and in-season training and also Brad Pulley in supporting Mal in his role. Also thank you to our Trainers- Bobby Collins and Pam Fairbank for attending to the many umpires who saw them at training and throughout the Finals Series to get treatment.

Thank you to the entire umpiring group (field, boundary and goal) for their commitment, dedication and passion during the season. Also, thanks to all umpires for their willingness to step up during the tough periods, doing double ups where necessary and helping the Juniors on a Sunday when needed.

A big thank you to the EFLUA President David Parker and his committee for the great work they have done in 2025. The time, effort, energy and care that you all put in is very much appreciated.

To the league CEO Jy Bond and the EFNL staff - Dean, Kirsty, Laura, Daniel, Heath, Alice and Ryan for their support and assistance along the way. It's a dedicated team looking after such a big competition, and they work hard during the season with little down time to ensure the competitions are run professionally.

CLUB AND COMMUNITY

IT HAS BEEN A PRIVILEGE TO REMAIN IN THE LEAGUE AND SUPPORT OUR MEMBERS IN MY NEW ROLE. A DEDICATED RESOURCE TO ASSIST CLUBS IN SEVERAL WAYS. THE ROLE HAS BECOME A REAL RESOURCE ACROSS THE LEAGUE. IT HAS BEEN EXCITING TO CONTINUE TO SUPPORT OUR CLUBS AND MEMBERS ACROSS THE FULL GAMBIT OF CLUB OPERATIONS.

A big positive this year was grant applications for clubs. Clubs really leaned in and we saw a strong lift in successful applications—especially through AFL Victoria—to make facilities safer and more sustainable. You can see the impact across improvements to lighting, netting, scoreboards and change rooms.

Our Women & Girls Charter night was well received. We have doubled accreditation from 8 to 16 clubs in 2025, and we're tracking towards 30 by 2026. Our league has already showed the lead in our women's space however we now see the successful clubs integrate organically rather than an add-on, which is exactly what we want.

We know the toughest challenge for many clubs is volunteers—both recruiting and keeping them. More clubs are now exploring the over-55s JobSeeker pathway, and that's our number one focus moving forward: making clubs more sustainable and to take the pressure off committees by spreading the load.

One thing that stood out this year was how well clubs shared ideas. That collaboration made my role easier, and the lessons we have picked up will help us pass good practice around the league faster. I also want to acknowledge our junior and senior finals hosts, so many volunteers rolled up their sleeves during the busiest part of the season. Clubs are run like businesses now, and it takes capable people to keep them sustainable. And big thanks to EFNL staff who put in huge hours planning and delivering major events and our finals series.

On the footy side, we sent Coach Co-ordinators into clubs to up skill more junior coaches, and we rolled out "Coach Your Way" to bring more women through with Level 2 accreditation. We also helped clubs find coaches, recruit players and keep their lists together. On revenue, we shared simple ideas that worked—cleaner membership bundles, easier-to-sell sponsor packages, better match-day and events—so clubs could raise more without burning out volunteers.

A highlight was seeing Doncaster Football Club plan and set up for a return in 2026 after a short recess. The effort they have put into rebuilding quickly has been outstanding. Thanks as well to every club that completed a health check—it helped me focus support on where it was needed most. Club sustainability is our number one priority and 2026 will see increased investment in this area.

I am excited to build on the connections and momentum we were able to generate and look forward to hitting the ground running for season 2026. Thanks to Club Presidents, committees, players, volunteers, supporters and the EFNL team (Kirsty, Ryan, Scott, Laura, Dean, Daniel and Alice) and for CEO Jy Bond for the backing in my first 12 months.

YEAR IN REVIEW

FEBRUARY

Heath Black is appointed as the Eastern Football Netball League's official Club and Community Manager.

MARCH

The league hosted a Club Development Night at Fairpark Reserve ahead of the 2025 season, with club delegates invited to attend. A great opportunity for representatives from all clubs to connect, network, and receive important information for the season ahead.

The 2025 Ringwood Mazda Netball season commences. A total of 16 divisions, and the addition of multiple clubs entering a team for the first time in their existence or returning to the competition for the first time in years.

Silvan and Coldstream kick-start the senior football season in a standalone game a week prior to the rest of the competition. The Cats started the year with an impressive 52-point win at Silvan Recreation Reserve.



APRIL

EFNL entered 2 local tournaments in preparation for the upcoming Association Championships in June. The league was delighted to be Premiers of the Dandenong & District Netball Association Open Age Championship Division and Runners Up in the Reserves Division.

The 2025 Junior Interleague Coaches were announced ahead of this season's AFL Victoria Metro Junior Development Series, with Wayne Judge taking the role of EFNL Director of Coaching.

Hawthorn Vice Captain Dylan Moore was announced as Head Coach of the Under 14 Division One Boys. Lilydale's Captain Riley Clausen joined the coaching crew, leading the Division Two Boys side.

Jesse Uren and Andrew Smith returned to the coaching ranks, announced as the Division One and Two Head Coaches for the Under 15's Boys.

A strong performance from the EFNL's Netball Association Championship Squad at the Dandenong and District Association's annual tournament. The team finished 4th overall in their pool of 7 with 3 wins and 3 losses, only narrowly missing out on a top 3 finish.

JULY

The EFNL recognised NAIDOC Round as many clubs wore Indigenous designed jumpers. Smoking ceremonies were held at grounds such as Coldstream Reserve and Vermont Recreation Reserve.

The venues for the 2025 EFNL Senior and Veterans finals series were announced. Pinks Reserve, Kilsyth, was selected as the venue for the Division One Senior Men's Grand Finals, with the newly redeveloped East Burwood Reserve set to host the Division One Qualifying and Semi Final.

History for the Beaconsfield Football Club, as Holm Park Reserve is selected for three Premier Division finals for the first time since joining the league.



AUGUST

Across two big nights at Maroondah Nets, a total of 16 Netball Grand Finals were played in front of terrific crowds. The season capped off with the Premier Division Grand Final between Croydon and East Ringwood. After some near misses in previous years, Croydon were crowned Premiers as they defeated the Roos by 15 points, completing an undefeated season campaign.

For the first time, the league held a Women's Grand Final Breakfast at Doncaster Mecure on Friday, 22nd of August. A great opportunity to reflect and celebrate the achievements and contributions of the Women who participate in the Eastern Football Netball League.

H.E Parker Reserve and Quambee Reserve played host to Senior Women's and Veterans Grand Final Day on Saturday, 23rd August.

Another Premier Division thriller saw Park Orchards and South Belgrave go head-to-head for their first premiership at the top level. The Sharks, in their first year of Premier footy after the 2024 flag, held on for a three-point win. YEAR IN REVIEW

SEPTEMBER

The Eastern Football Netball League hosted the 2025 Junior Presentation Night at Crossways for a fourth consecutive season, where the top three of each junior division from the Under 12's to Under 18's were presented on stage. Bayswater Junior Football Club celebrated a fantastic year in the competition by winning this year's Gordon Parker Best Conducted Club award.

The Senior Men's Grand Finals started in dramatic fashion with the Division Three Grand Final between Scoresby and Donvale coming down to the final kick of the day. A shot after the siren from outside 50 for Donvale fell short as they went down in the decider by just two points, the third time in four years. For Scoresby, they celebrated back-to-back flags as the old powerhouse continues its rise up the divisions.

The Dockers led by as much as 36 points in a dominant opening half before a six-goal unanswered third term for Wantirna South put the Devils in control. A thrilling final term where 11 goals were kicked between both sides as Wantirna South held on for a one-point premiership victory.

Pinks Reserve, Kilsyth held the Division One Grand Final on Sunday, 14th September as the last two Division One Runners Up's met, South Belgrave and Park Orchards. The fourth senior Grand Final to come down to the final moments of the game, the Saints' Tim Smith took a Leo Barry-inspired mark in the dying seconds to secure South Belgrave a two-point win and send the club to Premier Division for the first time in their history.

The 2025 EFNL season came to an official end on Saturday, the 20th of September at Bayswater Oval for the Premier Division Senior Men's Grand Final. Balwyn, chasing back-to-back flags, took on Blackburn, seeking their first at the top flight.



Yet another thrilling, tight encounter on the big stage saw the premiership come down to the wire. Balwyn kicked the last three goals of the term in the final seven minutes of the game to pinch a three-point win and back-to-back flags. Jarrod Lienert starred, kicking the match-winner and the best on ground honours, awarded the Cliff Tomkins Medal.

The combined margin for all five Senior Men's Grand Finals, an incredible 16 points, an average of just 3.2 points per game.

The league hosted the 2025 Chandler Medal on the 24th of September for the first time at Marvel Stadium. In a thrilling final few rounds of the count, the Chandler Medal finished in a tie between East Ringwood's Josh Tovey and Blackburn's Toby Wooller, on 20 votes each.






